

Application for Swimming Pool Compliance Certificate

Section 22D of the Swimming Pools Act 1992

This is an application to request Council to undertake an inspection of the safety barrier of a swimming pool or spa to determine whether a 'Certificate of Compliance' can be issued pursuant to the Swimming Pools Act 1992.

- A certificate of compliance remains valid for the period of 3 years from the date on which it was issued but ceases to be valid if a direction is issued under Section 23 in respect of the swimming pool to which the certificate relates.
